

Authorship Guidelines for Studies under the Programme for Ocular Inflammation & Infection Translational Research

1. General Criteria for Authorship:

To be included as an author, an individual must have contributed more than 10 patients from their center who meet the study's inclusion criteria. (Please note: Some studies rely on specific variables for analysis. If incomplete data is submitted, the corresponding patients will be excluded from the study. As a result, your center may not be eligible for authorship on that particular publication.)

2. Principal Investigators:

 The Principal Investigator (PI) of each contributing center will be listed on the title page of the manuscript as a key contributor.

3. Journals with Authorship Limits:

- If the journal imposes a limit on the number of authors, the following rules will apply:
 - The **first author** will be the fellow or lead who has contributed significantly to the **writing of the manuscript**, **data analysis**, **and project leadership**.
 - Three authors will be reserved for the Steering Committee or equivalent oversight group.
 - The remaining authorship positions will be allocated based on each contributor's **patient enrollment**, with priority given to those who enrolled the highest number of patients meeting the study's inclusion criteria.

4. Co-authorship for Data Collection:

- In addition to the PI, for every 50 patients enrolled by a center, the center may designate one additional co-author.
- Each participating center may add up to a maximum of five coauthors, including the PI, to the manuscript. (Table 1)
- These co-authors can include fellows, clinicians, and other key contributors to data collection or study execution at each center.
- These co-authors will be listed in the Study Group List

Table 1. co-author allocation based on the number of patients contributed

For 10 to 50 patients: A center can have 1 author (which will typically be the Principal Investigator).



For more than 50 but fewer than 100 patients: The center can have 2 authors in total (the Principal Investigator plus 1 additional co-author).

For more than 100 but fewer than 150 patients: The center can have 3 authors in total (the Principal Investigator plus 2 additional co-authors).

For more than 150 but fewer than 200 patients: The center can have **co-authors** in total (the Principal Investigator plus 3 additional co-authors).

For more than 200 patients: The center can have the maximum of **co-authors** in total (the Principal Investigator plus 4 additional co-authors).

5. Additional Contributions:

 Significant contributions to study design, statistical analysis, or writing of the manuscript, even without patient enrollment, may also be considered for authorship, subject to the discretion of the steering committee and based on ICMJE guidelines on authorship (https://www.icmje.org).
